Traffic Management Scheme

The final draft of the traffic management scheme consisting of "H" markings, double yellow lines and bus stop road markings has been produced. Public consultation will take place in the Parish Rooms on Thursday 19th August, 3pm to 6pm. This is a drop in session. Members of the public will be able to view the planned road markings and make comment. A member from BMBC Highways will be present to answer any questions.

Plant a tree for the Jubilee

The Queen's Green Canopy (QGC) is a tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022. Everyone across the UK is being invited to plant trees from October 2021 through to the end of the Jubilee year in 2022.

Overhanging vegetation

It's that time of year again; rain and sunshine results in a lot of growth in our gardens. Please could you check that shrubs and other vegetation from your garden is not

overhanging the public footpaths making it difficult for members of the public to pass, and if it is, to cut it back as soon as possible.

Cycling on public footpaths

Whilst cycling for health and enjoyment is to be encouraged, cycling on public footpaths such as the one alongside the cricket ground from the bottom of Dark Lane running into Canon Hall Park, is prohibited. Cycling on a bridleway, e.g. Dark Lane, is allowed but cyclist must dismount and walk on footpaths. The Public Footpath/Bridleway signs indicate which type the path is.

Cawthorne Little Library

The "Little Library" in the bus shelter on Taylor Hill is proving popular. There has been a call for more children's books. A thank you to the volunteers who are keeping an eye on it, making sure it remains tidy.

The Fountain Bench

An administrative error meant that the word "kept" was missed off the inscription. The Parish Council is to see if this can be rectified.

Litter Bin on Dark Lane

The dog litter bin down Dark Lane is frequently overflowing with coffee cups etc. with excess litter being left on the ground. The Parish Council is to purchase a larger all-purpose litter bin from BMBC.
