3. Email sent to cricket club regarding traffic speeding on Dark Lane. Reply that without specific times and dates it is difficult to provide a detailed response; there are signs.
4. Neighbourhood Services have contacted Safer Neighbourhood Team asking them to investigate grass cuttings being dumped on the footpaths.
5. BMBC contacted regarding the 5 estate agents' boards now on A635 opposite the entrance to Tivydale. Reply that they have contacted the estate agents concerned and asked for them to be removed asap.
6. A handrail on the Iron bridge was reported missing. PRow responded to say that that and the bridge on FP 14 have now been repaired.
7. Missing and loose topping off Kexborough Bridge reported to BMBC.
8. Reported to BMBC that the vegetation at Kexborough Bridge needs removing. Reply that Cawthorne Lane has been inspected and the trees, bushes and verges have been cut back, no safety interventions noted and no safety issues.
